Please speak to your veterinarian about when to de-worm young kittens and which product is best.

All medications have the potential to cause side effects. Most are mild and self limiting such as nausea and loss of appetite. If you notice your cat is unwell after being de-wormed, please seek the advice of your veterinarian.

Not all anti-parasitic medications treat all parasites (the most common being fleas and worms), so it is important to make sure all common parasites are covered which usually means the use of two products. Speak to your veterinarian to make sure the products you are using are safe to use in conjunction.

Never use anti-parasitic products for dogs on your cat. Most contain active ingredients which are toxic.

\* When using any products to prevent heartworm, it is essential you have your cat tested for heartworm prior to commencing heartworm preventative medications.
